CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

To commemorate World Asthma Day on May 7th, Allegheny General Hospital and West Penn Allegheny Health System are presenting a Summit on asthma and other serious health issues relating to air pollution in the Pittsburgh region. The Summit will focus on asthma causes, its high prevalence in our region, and gaps in treatment of the disease. The Summit will also examine newly presented research findings about other air pollutionrelated health impacts in our region including cancer, premature birth and low birth weight, cardiopulmonary illness and premature death.

INTENDED AUDIENCE AND OBJECTIVES

This conference is intended for internal medicine and family practice physicians, pediatricians, physician's assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses, asthma specialists, pulmonary specialists, cardiac specialists, obstetricians, public health specialists and members of the community. The Summit is open to the public and is free for all nonmedical professionals (medical professionals pay a nominal fee).

At the conclusion of the conference, participants should have the ability to:

- identify the full range of key health impacts associated with air pollution in the Pittsburgh region
- summarize the current asthma epidemic in Pittsburgh
- identify asthma control strategies
